#### Questions asked

The Board members and I have been asked many times "What does a HOA (Home Owners Association) do and why do we have one". Here is a brief explanation:

1) What does an HOA do? HOA's are usually formed within communities or neighborhoods of single-family homes or multiple-unit buildings such as townhomes or condominiums. An HOA is typically established to make and enforce rules regarding the properties within the jurisdiction, An HOA has a board of directors which are to enforce and oversee the HOA'S rules and regulations such as the restrictive Covenants and By-Laws. Most HOAs are incorporated so they're subject to state laws. An HOA usually refers to a group of people who want to better their community and the real estate values of the property there. The HOA Board is responsible for the organizations finances and it oversees the collection and management of funds. Along with setting dues and assessments, the board can slap fines on homeowners who break the rules or damage the common areas. HOAs can also place a lien on a property if the homeowner falls seriously behind on their dues. The fees of HOA's are

- typically \$200 to \$400 a month but can range anywhere from less than \$100 to upward of \$10,000 in luxury neighborhoods or communities.
- Why? Because the communities that are in the HOA (first established by Bartelt) voted it in when the covenants were revitalized in 2015.
